**AN ACT TO AMEND §§ 61541(a)(5), 61541(b)(3), AND  
61541(c)(3); TO REPEAL § 61542; AND TO ADD A NEW §  
61541(e), ALL OF SUBARTICLE 5, ARTICLE 5,  
CHAPTER 61, DIVISION 2, TITLE 21, GUAM CODE  
ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO THE REGULATION OF  
POLITICAL SIGNS.**

1       **BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:**

2       **Section 1.**   § 61541(a)(5) of Subarticle 5, Article 5, Chapter 61, Division 2,  
3 Title 21, Guam Code Annotated, is *amended* to read:

4               “(5) Political signs that advocate voting for or against candidates, or  
5 other matters to be considered by the electorate; provided, that such signs *shall*  
6 *only* be posted on private property. If such private property is adjacent to any  
7 roadway, political signs *shall* be at least eight (8) feet from the paved portion  
8 of the roadway, and posted in such a manner that would *not* impede traffic or  
9 a driver’s visibility. Political sign means all free-standing billboards, posters,  
10 banners, or displays that advocate a candidate for political office or any matter  
11 to be presented to the electorate for vote, and all items put on property to erect

1 or secure the billboard, poster, banner, or display in place, including rebars  
2 and wires.”

3 **Section 2.** § 61541(b)(3) of Subarticle 5, Article 5, Chapter 61, Division 2,  
4 Title 21, Guam Code Annotated, is *amended* to read:

5 “(3) Political signs that advocate voting for or against candidates, or  
6 other matters to be considered by the electorate; provided, that such signs *shall*  
7 *only* be posted on private property. If such private property is adjacent to any  
8 roadway, political signs *shall* be at least eight (8) feet from the paved portion  
9 of the roadway, and posted in such a manner that would *not* impede traffic or  
10 a driver’s visibility. Political sign means all free-standing billboards, posters,  
11 banners, or displays that advocate a candidate for political office or any matter  
12 to be presented to the electorate for vote, and all items put on property to erect  
13 or secure the billboard, poster, banner, or display in place, including rebars  
14 and wires.”

15 **Section 3.** § 61541(c)(3) of Subarticle 5, Article 5, Chapter 61, Division 2,  
16 Title 21, Guam Code Annotated, is *amended* to read:

17 “(3) Political signs that advocate voting for or against candidates, or  
18 other matters to be considered by the electorate; provided, that such signs *shall*  
19 *only* be posted on private property. If such private property is adjacent to any  
20 roadway, political signs *shall* be at least eight (8) feet from the paved portion  
21 of the roadway, and posted in such a manner that would *not* impede traffic or  
22 a driver’s visibility. Political sign means all free-standing billboards, posters,  
23 banners, or displays that advocate a candidate for political office or any matter  
24 to be presented to the electorate for vote, and all items put on property to erect  
25 or secure the billboard, poster, banner, or display in place, including rebars  
26 and wires.”

1           **Section 4.** § 61542 of Subarticle 5, Article 5, Chapter 61, Division 2, Title  
2 21, Guam Code Annotated, is *repealed*.

3           **Section 5.** A new § 61541(e) is *added* to Subarticle 5 of Article 5, Chapter  
4 61, Division 2, Title 21, Guam Code Annotated, to read:

5                   “(e) The provisions of this Section *shall not* apply to any political sign  
6 used in connection with roadside waving on property by person(s) who  
7 actively attend said roadside waving.”
